'Psychosocial Care for Flood Affected'



In the context of the flood and landslide in Kerala and its disastrous aftermath (August 2018), 10 students of 2nd year M.Sc Applied Psychology actively participated in the relief and rehabilitation activities from 24th August to 5th September, 2018 in the affected areas. Initially the students were trained from the Department of Applied Psychology. In the action area the whole process of providing psychological care was implemented at two levels; first through Camp Visits and then through House Visits. In addition to intervention program the students provided training to volunteers of health and social justice department like ASHA workers, Anganwadi workers and Kudumbasree members. This helped in providing better extension to people by facilitating the reach of psychological first aid. There was an abundance of help and support from various ministries and departments of Government of Kerala such as Local Self-Government, Revenue and Health Department, District Medical Officer, Department of Social Justice and Community Development Societies. The intervention programme named 'Psychosocial Care for Flood Affected' was organized by Department of Women and Child Development, Department of Health and Family Welfare, District Mental Health Programme, Government of Kerala and National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS), Bengaluru.

In this context, the role of peer support really significant. Peer counselling focuses on peers helping peers. Psychologists have a great role in facilitating peer counsellors for this purpose. In this purview, Dr. Mamman Joseph C, Assistant Professor, Department of Applied Psychology organised a three-day 'Suicide Prevention Training Programme' wherein peer counselling training was given to 24 selected students from 12 different departments. The training programme commenced on 12th September, and was concluded on 14th September, 2017. The extensive training included various activities like selfreflection, simulation of counselling sessions, informal way of counselling etc.



Marathon: Spreading Awareness on Suicide Prevention

On behalf of the Suicide Prevention Week a marathon was conducted on 15th September 2017. Prof. S. Bhuvaneswari, Registrar, emphasised the need for suicide prevention and flagged off the event. Apart from the Registrar, Prof. T. Sengadir, Dean, Academics, Prof. S. Nagarajan, Dean, Students' Welfare and other faculties of the academia graced the occasion with their presence. More than 50 students showed their interest in spreading awareness about suicide prevention by being part of the marathon. The winners of the marathon were awarded with certificate, medal and cash prize by Prof. S. Nagarajan, Dean, Students' Welfare.
