Participation from the Department of Music in the 257th Sri Sangeetha Mumurti Jayanthi Festival @ Tiruvarur



Tiruvarur is the birthplace of the Trinity of South Indian Music and each year their birth is celebrated during April-May. Music performances are organized at Lord Tyagaraja Swami – Kamalamba temple, where artists from all over the country pay the musical tribute. The highlight of the programme is the group rendering of the Pancaratna Kirtana-s of Sri Tyagaraja. During the 257th Sri Sangeeta Mummurthi Jayanti festival on 11th April 2019, the faculty members, Dr. V Premalatha and Dr. Harish Narayan, Mr. N Manoj (UGC-JRF Research scholar) and R Soundarya from IMA Economics rendered the Pancaratna kirtana-s along with other musicians. Earlier Compositions of Saint Tyagaraja was also rendered in his house, where he was born. Honorable Governor of Tamil Nadu, Sri Banwarilal Purohit was the chief guest of the function.

Bhagavatha Mela is an ancient traditional theatre art form (dance drama) combining classical music,



National Seminar on 'Compositions on kshetra-s'

Sri Sathguru Sangeetha Vidyalayam, College of Music and Research Centre, Madurai organized a National Seminar on 'Compositions on kshetra-s' on 28th June 2019. Mr. N Manoj (UGC-JRF scholar)

presented a paper on 'Arunagirinathar's Contribution of Thiruppugazh on Svamimalai kshetra'. The paper focused on the greatness and technical aspects of Thiruppugazh songs, composed on the presiding deity of Svamimalai temple.

In the same event, Mr. P. Nirmal Harish (Ph.D. Scholar) presented a paper on the title 'Musical compositions of different composers of the Pre-trinity period on the kshetra -Tiruvarur'. The paper was based on the contributions of the various composers on the presiding deities of Tiruvarur temple until the pre-trinity period (before 18th century). Both the papers have been accepted for publication.

techniques of the raga-s in the approach of the alapana and rendition of the kalpana svara-s, which would be highly helpful for students.

Miss. Bhairavi, a performer on South Indian Classical Violin, is passionate in studying the impact of music on the human behavior, thus experimenting on the Psychological effects. This is the first **Inter-disciplinary Research topic** at the Department, involving **MUSIC & Psychology.**

On-going Publication Project Work

Dr. V Premalatha is a recipient of the Research Publication Project of the National Mission for Manuscripts, Govt. of India. She is in the process of publishing an unpublished music work called Talalakshanam of 15th century from ancient Palm leaf manuscripts. In connection to that, she visited various libraries to collect the information, like Oriental Manuscripts Library, University of Kerala, Kariavattom campus, Government Oriental Manuscripts Library, Chennai. The project is to get completed by the end of December.
