


World Population Day

The meet was inaugurated by Prof. R. B. Singh, Secretary General & Treasurer, the International Geographical Union (IGU) and Prof. N. Sivagnanam, President of the Indian Geographical Society (IGS). Many senior/eminent geographers of India participated in the event and have made very fruitful deliberations for symbiotic development of Geographical Institutions in India. The programme was widely appreciated and sets a landmark for organising this kind of meet.



13.10.2020 - Disaster Day (Coordinator: K. Balasubramani)















18.11.2020 - GIS Day
