

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY



The Central University of Tamil Nadu was established by the act of parliament (Act no.25 of 2009). The university is located at Thiruvarur district of Tamil Nadu, which is 60 km east of Thanjavur. It is part of the Central Government's larger responsibility in making higher education more accessible to people from lower socioeconomic backgrounds. The university is devoted to imparting and maintaining quality in all aspects of Higher Education in order to

address the challenges of the knowledge era and to stay up with the knowledge surge.

The university operates in 516.7 acres of land allocated by the government of Tamil Nadu, in two villages Neelakudi and Nagakudi. The academic campus is located in Neelakudi village (412.03 acres) and the residential campus in Nagakudi village (104.73 acres). Amid the quiet rural environment this unitary, residential university pops with academic activity—research, teaching, and assessment with unrestricted autonomy in the form of schools that constantly experiment with curricula, syllabi, teaching, learning, testing, and evaluation methods. On campus, students and instructors live together, allowing teaching and learning to extend beyond classwork and the classroom.

The University now has over 2133 students enrolled. Admission is by means of a common entrance examination, which allows students from all over India to write the exam at any of the seven universities and join the University of their Choice based on merit.

Students, faculty members, and staff members are from all around India, and together they make up the diverse India that our country is. The university is clearly prepared to write a new chapter on India's intellectual horizon with its projectile focus.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK

The Department of Social Work, Central University of Tamil Nadu was established in 2013 to provide professional training in the discipline of Social Work. The Department offers a regular two years full-time Postgraduate program in Social Work, titled as Master of Social Work

(MSW). The program offers three specializations - Medical & Psychiatric Social Work, Community Development, and Human Resource & Labour Management. The



Department of Social Work ensures the students with the multi-pronged strategy of Skill Development through well Structured Field Work Practicum. The department also offers M.Phil., Ph.D., and Post-Doctoral programs. The Department has already proved its merit as a center of excellence in Social Work education attracting students from across the states in India. A unique feature of the programs offered by the Department of Social Work in CUTN is the multicultural setting in which it functions with students, teaching, and non-teaching staff belonging to different states in India and from diverse social and cultural backgrounds. In addition, the rural setting of the University also acts as a live lab for the Social Work students to have direct exposure to the community setting and its dynamics. The Department has undertaken several community outreach programs from the time of its establishment in association with academic, Government & Non-Government institutions in the locality.

In order to realise its objective of being a learning Centre in the field of social work, the Department also engages in skill development Programmes, extension lectures, knowledge-building workshops, national and international seminars, research projects, and so on. The teaching faculties of the Department are subject experts in various fields of Social Work practice including public health, mental health, community development, environment and development, social policy, Human Resource Management, etc. and provide consultancy to academic, Government & Non-Government institutions in the local to a global setting. They are also engaged in research and advocacy in different social sectors contributing to evidence-based instruction and practice.

community participation and also helping the affected families. Through fieldwork, the trainee was able to acquire many skills that may help for professional and personal growth. The fieldwork trainee learned the skills like documentation skills, empathetic skills, problem-solving skills, communication skills, technical skills, etc.



Fieldwork trainee **ALTHAF K ASHARAF** (1st year MSW) visited the Ayyappancoil Grama Panchayath in the Idukki district of Kerala. The Community is situated in an environmentally vulnerable area so that environmental issues like a landslide, soil erosion, etc are a major issue in the village. Other problems include alcoholism, drug abuse, waste management, etc. Trainee learned about PRA and its tools, Resource Mapping, Venn Diagram, and Ritual Mapping. conducted a survey among youth to check the attitude towards the election and analyzed the data, learned about the geographical location and people composition of the community, about the educational and ritual profile of the community, visited PHC, and learned about the health care facilities of the community, understood the level of women participation in the community, about ICDS and its projects, visited Krishi Bhavan and learned about the agricultural pattern.



The trainee RESHMA. K (1st year MSW) did her internship under Nilambur Tribal Special Project. The trainee gained an intensive understanding of the Tribal Special Project under the Kudumbashree mission and the socio-cultural conditions of the tribes. Trainee observed and learned various projects undertaken by NTSP like 'AaduGramam Project-supporting the post-flood livelihood of tribes; Ganthe project-support to mobilize

economic system; and women construction group. Trainee attended the meeting of 'AaduGramam' Project and Ganthe project, attended the auditing of kudumbasree units, attended awareness class given for tribal women, the capacity building training camp for NHGs executives, Animators, and Promoters, and visited the construction site of women construction group.

Case study: The trainee Akhila TS (2nd year MSW) did her internship at Bethsads Hospital, Vengola, Ernakulum district, Kerala. The trainee took case studies as part of the internship. Client XX of 25-year-old, male employed as a packing staff in cargo was admitted to the hospital due to the violent nature of his behaviour. The mode of onset was insidious with a 5-year duration of illness. He had no relevant past psychiatric history and his family history was quite good. The thought process of the client seems to be of flight of ideas- deviating from one idea to another, he had often exaggerated changes in mood, where strong emotions or feelings occur. Through continuous observation and interaction, the patient is diagnosed with bipolar mood disorder.

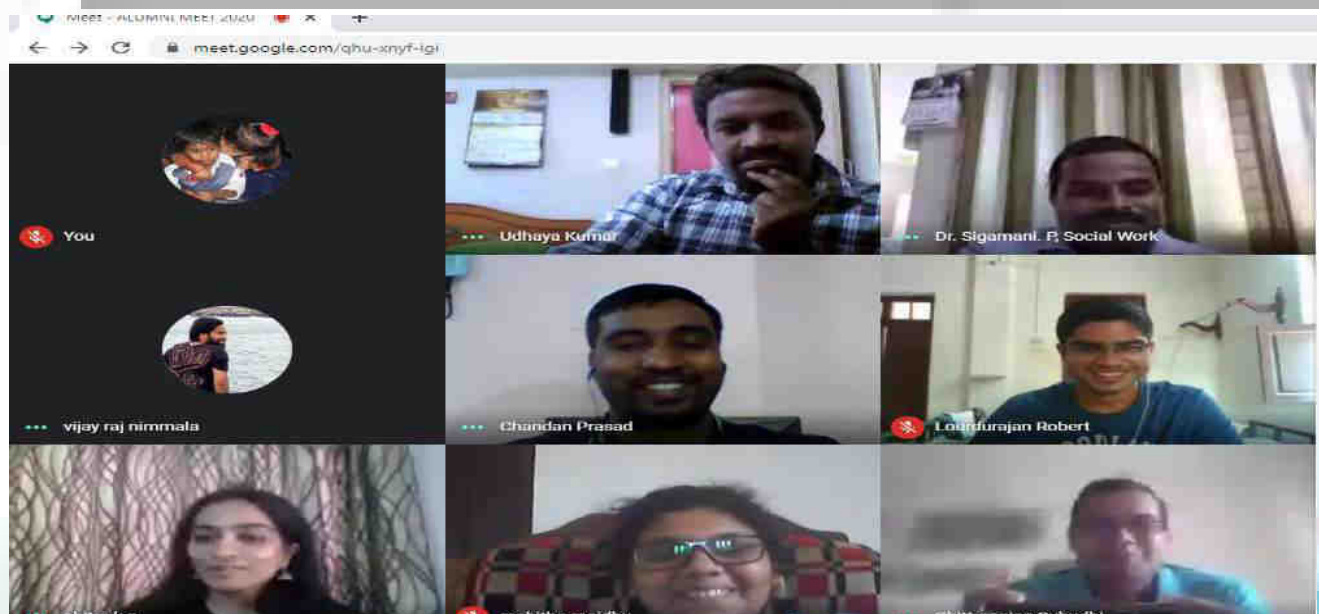
Activities carried out:

1. Directions and mental support for individuals under quarantine and individuals tested covid 19 positive
2. Functional support for covid 19 test camps.
3. Tele support for availing medical care for infected and quarantined individuals staying in private facilities.
4. Tracking individuals contacted with covid 19 infected patients and giving quarantine guidelines.

5. Awareness for IP and OP patients of taluk hospital regarding covid 19 protocols and guidelines.

Amid the outset of pandemic and subsequent lockdown, Vyshnavi. S of 2nd year MSW, took part in a mission to provide psychosocial support to the destitute and street dwellers in the Kozhikode district of Kerala. An initial baseline survey was carried out to understand the socio-economic status of the inmates and the need for a Re-Direction assessment was found. On this ground, the team prepared a questionnaire to understand the specific needs and requirements, and data was collected from individuals on a one-to-one basis. Based on the results of the redirection Assessment, the whole team was split into groups, and duties were assigned to them for the smooth functioning of the proposed activities. The street dwellers and destitute were moved into camps. The majority of the inmates had withdrawal symptoms and motivational issues and the team provided one-to-one intervention and made them understand the importance of a family, permanent job, status, importance of earnings, etc. For this, social Work methods like casework, group work, etc were carried out. Subsequently, their need for permanent shelter, identity proofs, and health cards were considered and various camps were organized to make them possible.

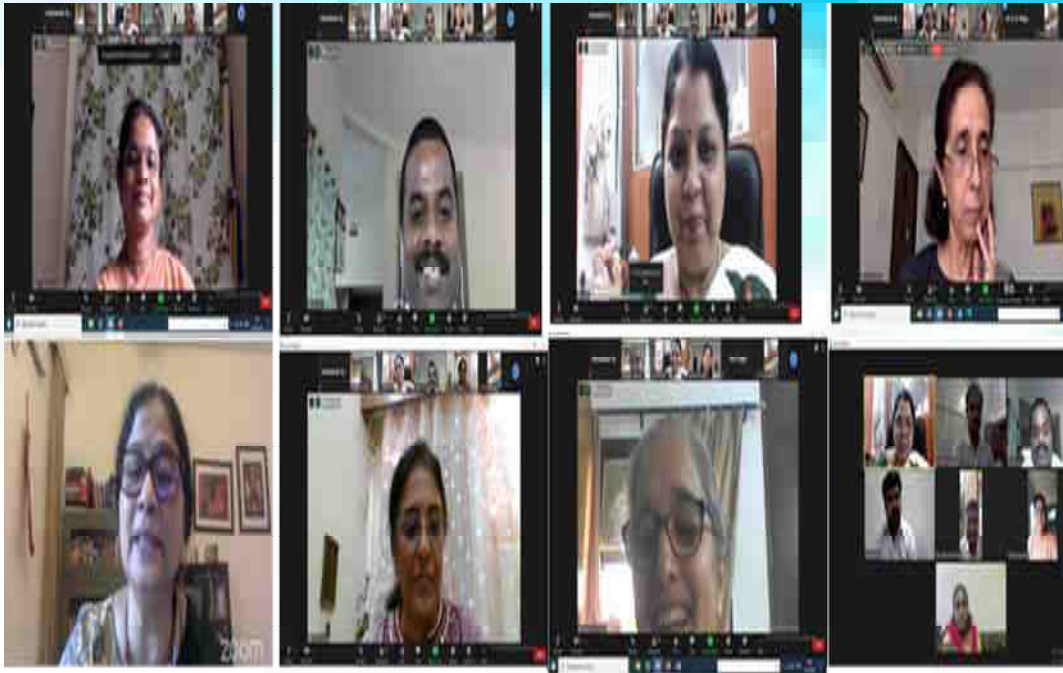

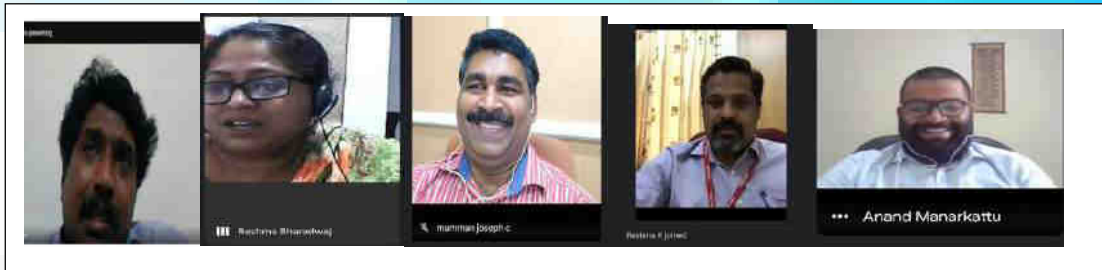

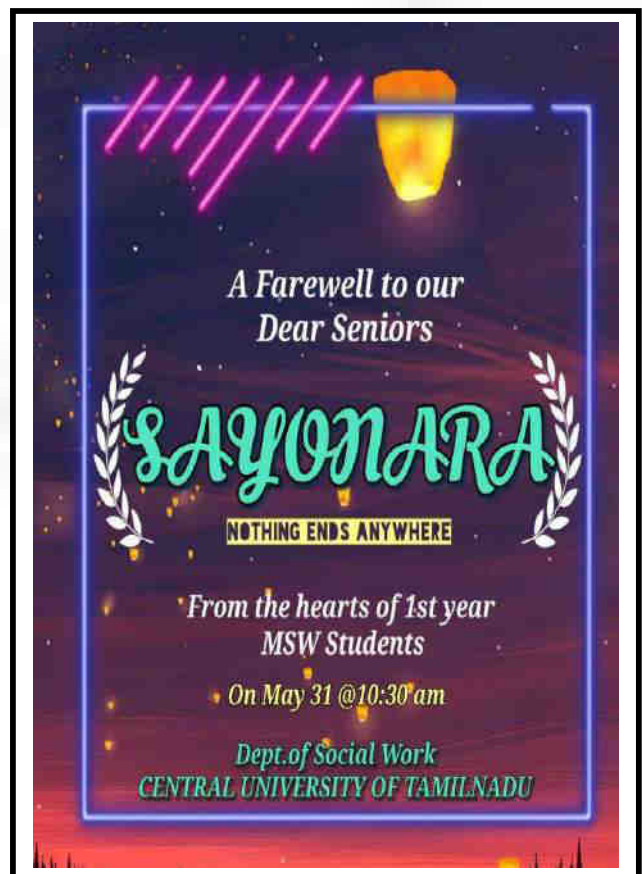
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
