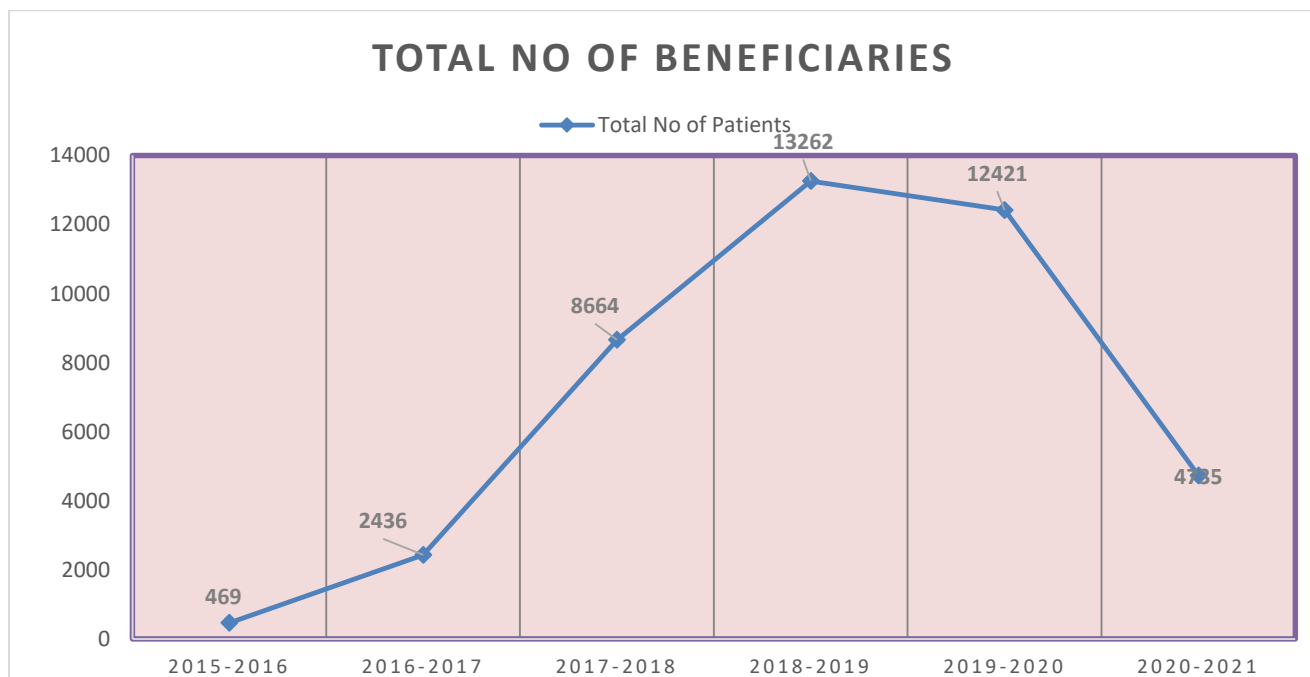


ANNUAL REPORT OF THE HEALTH CENTRE (2020-2021)

The health centre is located in the Residential campus annexure which is at the amidst of the staff residential area and academic zones. It provides primary health care and emergency services to the University community comprising of the students, staff members and their dependents. The health centre works round the clock for the outpatients and it has emergency care facility with Medical officers extending their service round the clock. The health centre is provided with all the essential emergency equipment to tackle all emergency conditions. The health centre has fully equipped ambulance and 24 hours pharmacy services.

2. INTENSIFIED PULSE POLIO IMMUNIZATION PROGRAMME-2021

Intensified Pulse Polio Immunization programme was organised by the Health centre on 31.1.2021. The programme was inaugurated by Prof .N. Nagarajan, Controller of Examination (I/C) by 9.00 am in the presence of medical officers, staff and parents. The programme was initiated by giving a lecture about the oral polio vaccine and its advantages. During the programme, all the children between 0-5 years were given polio drops. A supplementary Multivitamin drops were given to all children in the programme. Nearly 45 children of our university were benefitted by the Pulse Polio Immunization Programme.



3. NATIONAL DEWORMING WEEK PROGRAMME

The National Deworming week Programme was conducted in the 3rd week of March 2021 from 24th - 26th March for the University Fraternity and KV Students. The Medical Officers have visited the KV school and the students were explained about the effects of worms and the advantages of doing deworming. All the children between 1.5 to 18 years were dewormed with a dose of Albendazole tablet with proper advice. There were nearly 200 beneficiary of the programme.



4. Thermal Screening Check Points:

Thermal screening check points has been opened in both the Academic and Residential campus entrance of CUTN. One staff nurse and an attender are being posted in duty round the clock on all days. All the persons entering the campus are being checked with non-contact thermometer and enquired about the symptoms of corona virus infection and the travel history.



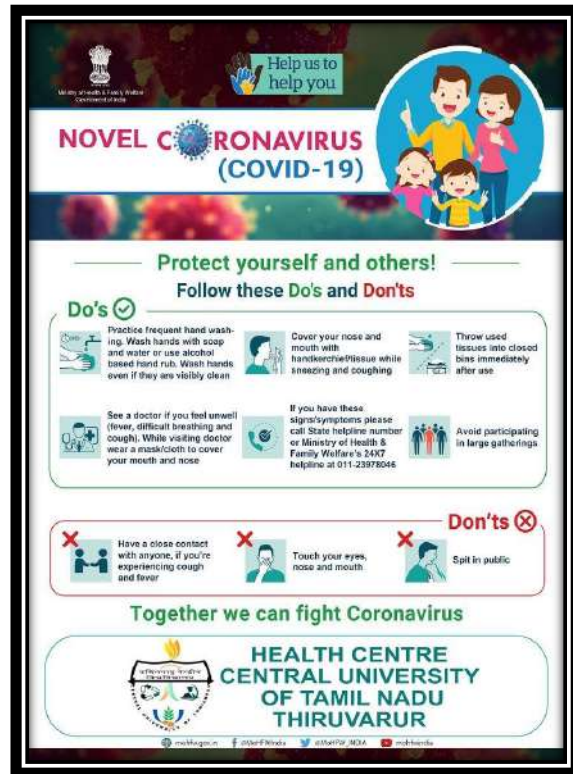
5. Disinfection Activities:

The streets of the academic and residential campus are disinfected with bleaching powder. A micro plan has been prepared to disinfect the residential buildings on weekly basis with 1% sodium hypochlorite solution.



6. Awareness Banners

Awareness Banners regarding the signs and symptoms of corona virus disease with preventive strategies has been displayed in the students and staff gathering places of the University to create awareness.



8. Quarantine Protocols

The Health Centre is following the protocols strictly which is being issued by the Government of Tamil Nadu from time to time. All the new faculty joining the institute were being quarantined in the guest house according to the Government of Tamil Nadu Protocols.



9. COVID – 19 VACCINATION CAMP – 2021

Due to increase in the surge of covid – 19 cases the health centre in association with the block PHC Perumpannaiyur organised vaccination camp for all beneficiaries above 45 years. The camp was inaugurated by our officiating vice chancellor Prof.R.Karpaga Kumaravel in the presence of Dr. R .Parameshwaran, Registrar (I/C), Prof. S. Nagarajan, COE (I/C), faculties and all the staffs. The beneficiaries were initially registered and all the vital screening was done and the vaccine was given to all the beneficiaries. Nearly 15 (male - 12, female - 03) above 45 years were benefitted by the camp.
