#### 1. Preamble

The Department of Music was established in the year 2017. CUTN is the only Central Institution in India offering Integrated Master's degree programme in South Indian Classical Music. The Department introduced an Undergraduate Course in Music in 2017, Research degree Programme in 2018 and Integrated Postgraduate degree programme in 2022. Music education has been extended to the students of other disciplines of CUTN too, as Open electives. Being the birthplace of the Trinity of South Indian Music, namely, Sri Syama Sastri, Sri Tyagaraja and Sri Muttusvami Dikshita, Thiruvarur has become an ideal place to propagate the rich music tradition propounded by them.
